Lobby Bar & Concessions: Lobby Bar opens one-hour prior to curtain for every performance. Food and drink purchased at our lobby bar are allowed in the theater. No outside food or drink allowed. Please dispose of trash in our convenient lobby receptacles.

Smoking: Smoking or vaping is strictly prohibited inside the Monon Depot Theatre and within 8 feet of outside entrances.

Right to Refuse Service: Civic Staff and House Management have the right to refuse service to audience members for any reason without issuing refunds.



Tribute to John Christopher Jones and Civic Theatre of Greater Lafayette

Jim and Pat Ross remember when ALCOA agreed to underwrite a three-year program that would bring a number of rising young performing artists to the Lafayette area for six weeks a year.



The second performer to arrive in Lafayette, Indiana, was a young actor named John Christopher Jones, and the sponsor was Civic Theatre. Chris delighted many audiences with his theatrical ability. After his time in Lafayette, Chris returned to New York City and continued to build a career acting and directing on Broadway, off–Broadway, in video, and film. Christopher was a regular on "On Our Own" and "The Popcorn Kid." Movies include Moonstruck, Awakenings, and Desperate Hours. Christopher later developed Parkinson's disease, which has not kept him from performing and directing.

In what may be his greatest one-time performance, Chris and Dan Moran, both suffering from Parkinson's, star in the documentary "Me to Play." It is a performance of Beckett's End Game while also showing the daily challenge of dealing with Parkinson's Disease.

Hello to all who have wandered in, wondering what exactly is in store for the next 2 hours.

The Amazing Maurice and His Educated Rodents is fun, a little ridiculous, and surprisingly deep. Yes, it's a fantasy. Yes, it's a parody of the pied piper. Yes, there are talking animals. But it's also about stories, friendship and how to think about the world around you. It's about morality. It's about society. It's about death. All of this, all these themes and lessons, wrapped up into a story children and adults alike can enjoy. It all takes place on the Discworld - a fantastical universe created by the late and great Sir Terry Pratchett. And really, that's all the worldbuilding you need. The rest is taken care of by the actors, the stage, and some suspension of disbelief.

In trying to stage *The Amazing Maurice*, I took note from the adaptor, and kept our set small and scene changes even smaller. The focus is on the story - how it weaves and wanders from one character to the next until everything connects and we leave with a happy ending. This is something Terry does incredibly well as a narrator, and bringing it to the stage is its own unique challenge. I hope you are able to sit back and enjoy all the little details.

And on a final, more personal note: this show is a lot of things to me. It's my first director's credit, a huge undertaking I'm still not sure I was mentally prepared for but have enjoyed nonetheless. It's a chance to share one of my favorite stories by one of my favorite authors. It's another way to show off just how talented the youth in this community are. It's a portal to another world where rats can talk, learn, and grow just like us. It's a way to laugh, a way to cry. And, perhaps most important to me, it's a love letter to my dad, who started and fostered a love for reading I'd be lost without. Love you lots, Dad.

That's probably enough from me, when you're really here to see these amazing actors. Thank you all for taking the time to come support the show!
